- 1. In today's feel-good culture, what is the common and coveted concept of a winning life, even in some church circles? Examples:
 - a. If it feels good, do it.
 - b. The highest goal of life is pleasure.
 - c. He who has the most toys wins.
 - d. Winning is ultimately about: "I, myself, and me"—my comfort, my career, and my circle of friends.
 - e. How is this self-centered concept of winning contrary to what Jesus taught about the winning life?
