Introduction:

1. The problem of evil and suffering in the world

2. God is watching. Satan is watching. Others are watching.

TEXT: Job 1:1-2:10

A. Winners are Watched by God (1:1-5)

1. God who watches us knows the **details** about our life.

2. You <u>can</u> be righteous by God's standards, you can be great in material riches, you can have a godly and happy family—if like Job, you are a devout worshipper of God and a devout spiritual example to your children, because of your faith in God.

B. Winners are Watched by Satan

Hard **lessons** regarding Satan. God permits Satan to test your faith.

1. Satan can ____ hurt __ you, but he cannot kill you without God's permission (1:6-12).

2. Satan can <u>incite</u> people to take away your material assets (1:13-17).

3. Satan can use natural disaster to ___kill____ your children (1:18-19).

4. Satan can **afflict** you with horrible sickness (2:4-8).

b. **More good news:** From the ashes of all his losses—losing all his wealth, losing all his ten children, and losing the moral support of his wife, Job overcame Satan and sin because he did not give up his <u>faith</u> in God, in spite of all his troubles (2:9-10)

C. Winners are Watched by Others

1. The significant **others** who watched Job and distanced themselves from him

a. Job's <u>wife</u> (2:10)

b. Job's **_relatives**_ and servants (19:14-19)

c. Job's intimate **friends** (Chapters 4-37)

2. God <u>spoke</u> to Job after debating with his friends (Chapter s 38-42), and Job's <u>reply</u> to God (42:1. 6).

3. God instructed Job to **___pray** for his friends before restoring his blessings (42:7-8).

4. The happy **ending** of Job's story (42:10-16).

Conclusion: Job's secret as a winner that we can apply to ourselves.

1. Job's relentless worship of God that was not affected by his tragic losses (1:20-22).

2. Job's enduring ___hope__ and faith in God that sustained him in his times of crisis (13:15; 19:25-27).

3. **Winning Affirmation:** I want God, Satan, and others to see me as a <u>winner</u> in Christ, for the glory of God."
