- 1. Total prosperity is for the <u>whole</u> person (1 Thess. 5:23).
- 2. Prosperity is abundant ______, not just abundant ______, livelihood______, [John 10:10; Luke 12:15).
- 3. Total prosperity is <u>marked</u> by: righteousness, peace, and joy (Rom. 14:17).
- 4. To <u>glorify</u> God is the ultimate <u>pupose</u> of our prosperity (Rom. 11:35-36).

TABLETALK STARTERS (For family devotions and Life Group discussion Read: Psalm 1:1-6 Psalm 1:1-6

- 1. In verses 1-3, "whatever he (the righteous) does prospers."
 - a. What is the scope of the righteous' prosperity?
 - b. What does "blessed" or happy imply about total prosperity-spiritual and material?
 - c. How does God's Word explain the prosperity of the wicked or unrighteous? Read the answer to this question in Psalm 73:1-28.
- 2. What makes the blessed or happy man happy? Refer to verses 1-2.
- 3. In verses 1 & 3, the blessed man is prosperous because:
 - a. He is morally righteous.
 - b. He is industrious (he works).
 - c. He is motivated by God's Word.
 - d. He is properly positioned and nourished.
