WISDOM TO BE A BILLIONAIRE By Ptr. Fred Mendoza

Introduction:

- 1. What is your comment on today's sermon topic, "Wisdom to be a Billionaire"?
- 2. Relevant questions:
 - a. Is there a direct correlation between the <u>worship</u> of God and <u>wealth</u> from God?
 - b. Is it possible to start as a God-worshipper and end up an <u>idol</u> worshipper?
 - c. Is it possible to <u>anger</u> God to destroy us and the blessings He has given us?
 - d. How can you and I remain <u>true</u> God-worshippers and <u>avoid</u> wrecking our lives later?
- Let's look at Solomon's 4 W's:
- A Solomon's W<u>orship</u> (1 Kings 3:1-4)
 - 1. Solomon was a "like father like son" worshipper (v. 3)
 - 2. Solomon showed his <u>love</u> for God as the <u>core</u> of his worship (v. 3).
 - 3. Solomon's worship of God involved <u>sacrifices</u> (v. 4; Romans 12:1)
- B. Solomon's W_isdom (1 Kings 3:4-15; 4:29-34)
 - 1. Worship of God gets God's <u>attention</u> and reward (v. 6).
 - 2. Young and inexperienced, Solomon's <u>request</u> was just right (vv. 7-9).
 - 3. Pleased, the Lord gave Solomon ______ than what he asked for (vv. 10-13)
 - 4. God gave Solomon a <u>conditional</u> promise of long life (v. 14).
 - 5. Solomon's <u>dream</u> became his God-given <u>vision</u> on how to lead his people.
 - 6. The <u>scope</u> of Solomon's wisdom is detailed in Chapter 4:29-34.

- C. Solomon's W<u>ealth</u> (1 Kings 10:14-15, 23-25)
 - Solomon's unequalled wealth gave him worldwide popularity and influence, but his exorbitant wealth was used for <u>his</u> pleasure and glory, instead of using it to influence people for <u>God</u>.
 - 2. Without realizing it, Solomon was <u>corrupted</u> by consuming his wealth on his palace, his chariots, and his 700 wives and 300 concubines.
 - 3. Very few people can handle exorbitant wealth without being **_corrupted_** by it.
- D. Solomon's W<u>reckage</u> (1 Kings 11:1-11)

Reasons why Solomon's life was wrecked:

- 1. He violated God's <u>marriage</u> rule (1 Kings 1:1; 11:1-4).
- 2. He became an ______ worshipper like his wives (vv. 5-8)
- 3. He angered God by his wayward <u>attitude</u> (vv. 9-11).

Conclusion: Did Solomon repent of his sins or he died an apostate?
