Introduction:

Text: Revelation 2:18-29 (NKJ)

Lead Question: How is the Thyatira church rated by Christ?

The Thyatira church is: praiseworthy, polarized, but promotable.

A. PRAISE-WORTHY for their (vv. 18-19)

- 1. **Deeds**
- 2. Love and faith
- 3. <u>Service</u> and <u>perseverance</u> (patience)
- 4. Patience
 - a. In doing good works (Galatians 6:9).
 - b. In <u>loving</u> one another (John 13:35; Romans 12:9-10; Colossians 3:12-14).
 - c. In <u>serving</u> others (Mark 10:45).
- 5. In doing <u>more</u> work than before (Revelation 2:19).

B. POLARIZED (vv. 20-24)

1. Polarized by Jezebel's teaching

- a. This self-styled prophetess is symbolically nicknamed <u>Jezebel</u> after the Old Testament Jezebel (1 Kings 16:29-34; 2 Kings 9:30-37).
- b. She was an influential but <u>misleading</u> teacher (vv. 20, 24).
- c. Christ offered her <u>mercv</u> before judgment (vv. 21-23a).
- d. Christ's <u>reason</u> for her deadly punishment (v. 23 b).

2. Insights:

- a. Why do denominations and local churches get polarized or divided?
- b. Today, Jezebel-type teachers poison churches and individuals through their **multimedia** platforms.
- c. The big problem is: <u>deep</u> understanding of the Scriptures is needed to discern what is right or wrong, the reason for discipling believers <u>deeply</u>.

C. PROMOTABLE (vv. 2:24-28)

- 1. Christ's **conditions** for the promotion (vv. 24-25).
- 2. The **double** promotion of overcomers (vv. 26-28).

Conclusion:

- 1. What is Christ's **basis** for evaluating us individually, and our church as a whole (Revelation 2:18)?
- 2. Even with a praiseworthy reputation as individuals and as a church,
 - a. What Jezebel teaching could we possibly tolerate to **______ please** others and make us **______ feel** good?
 - b. What <u>type</u> of idolatry could we possibly tolerate (Colossians 3:5 NLT)?
- 3. In Revelation 2:25-29, what is our response to Christ's challenge?

TABLETALK STARTERS (For family devotions and Life Group discussions) Read: Revelation 2:18-29

- 1. What does Christ's penetrating eyes or vision picture to you (v. 18)? Respond to these insights:
 - a. He can see the deepest thoughts of our mind and heart.
 - b. He knows everything about us—good or bad.
 - c. We cannot pretend to Him what we are not.
 - d. He knows our works, love, service, and patience (v. 19).
- 2. Discuss and apply Pastor Fred's article on Jezebel on the back page of the bulletin.
