- 1. King David is a great example of a warrior for God and yet he did not win all battles in his lifetime. What were some of the battles he won and lost and why is this a reality in our Christian lives?
- 2. In 1 Samuel 30:1, we find the unsuspecting David and his men under attack at Ziklag. Using 1 Peter 5:8 as a parallel passage, in what way this reveals the devil's schemes in attacking us?
- 3. Reading 1 Samuel 30:2-3 and John 10:10, how does the enemy steal away the abundant life God gave us?
- 4. In 1 Samuel 30:4-6, how does the initial attack lead to the overall fallout of David's army? What does this teach us about trials, testings or challenges in our lives?
- 5. The King James Version of 1 Samuel 30:6 says, "But David encouraged himself in the Lord his God." There rare words are used only five times in the entire Bible: 1 Samuel 30:6; 2 Chronicles 31:4; 2 Chronicles 35:2; Judges 20:22 and Isaiah 41:7. How do these passages reveal the sources of our encouragement.
- 6. How vital is prayer in our battle against the enemy (1 Samuel 30:7-10)?
- 7. What is the outcome if we apply these principles in our lives (1 Samuel 30:18-20)?
- 8. Close the Life Group meeting by sharing what the enemy has stolen from you and pray that God will help you overcome and recover all that was taken away.
