- 1. Moses is aware of his unique _____identity____ He knows who he is.
 - a. His **cultural** identity (Heb. 11:23-24)
 - b. His <u>spiritual</u> identity (Heb. 11:23, 26; Exo. 2: 1-10; Gen. 1:26-27, John 1:12, 1 Peter 2:9-12)
- 2. Moses has a sense of <u>destiny</u> He knows what God wants him to do with his life.
 - a. He has a sense of **purpose** (Exo. 3: 1-10)
 - b. He finds meaning and strength in his God-given mission in life (Acts 7:35-39)
- 3. Moses is mindful of <u>eternity</u>. He developed an eternal perspective.

His eternal perspective is evidenced in his:

- a. **Value** (Heb. 11:26; 10:32-34)
- b. **Choices** (Heb. 11:24-25)
- c. **Focus** (Heb. 11:27)
