#### **TABLE TALK QUESTIONS**

- 1. Let the different members of the Life Group read these Old Testament passages: Psalm 126:2; Psalm 89:1; Psalm 95:6; 2 Chronicles 29:28; Exodus 34:8; Psalm 47:1; Lamentations 3:41; 2 Chronicles 29:28; Psalm 150:4; Lamentations 3:25-26. Which one is the easier, the regular, and the hardest thing for you to do? How do these passages encourage you to worship beyond your comfort zone?
- 2. Continue to read these New Testament passages: Acts 3:8; Romans 12:1; Colossians 3:16; Hebrews 13:15. How are the New Testament and the Old Testament distinct from each other? How are they similar? How can we as a church apply these ways of worship in our gathered community?
- 3. Worship is not an unavoidable "either/or" between two alternatives. The balance between the Old Testament and the New Testament provides us with this framework. Musing on the following balance or tension, which principles stand out the most in your worship of God?
  - <u>Transcendent</u> and <u>Immanent</u> (Psalm 36:6; Matthew 1:23)
  - Head and Heart (Psalm 95:1-8)
  - Internal and External (1 Samuel 16:7; Matthew 15:8-9)
  - Vertical and Horizontal (Ephesians 2:14-18; 1 Corinthians 14:26)
  - Rooted and Relevant (Acts 17:22-27)
  - Church and the <u>Unchurched</u> (1 Peter 2:4-5; 1 Corinthians 14:23-25)
  - Event and Everyday (Psalm 84:1-4; Colossians 3:17)
- 4. Revelations 7:9-10 paints a picture of the future of worship. How does our future worship look like and how can we practice this in our worship gathering?
- 5. 1 Corinthians 14:26 says that when we come together, we share a hymn to edify one another. Whether you are meeting in person or virtually, close the Life Group session and share a hymn that can encourage the whole community.
