### A. DAVID'S MISSTEPS OF WORSHIP

1. He chose the wrong **people** (v. 1)
2. He had a wrong **priority** (v. 2)
3. He replaced a critical **procedure** of worship (v. 3a)
4. He employed **personality** (v. 3b)

1. He approached God with **sincerity** (v. 9-10)
2. He **submitted** everything to God (v. 13a)
3. He offered a **sacrifice** to God (v. 13b, 22)
4. He saw worship as a **sacred** calling (v. 14)
5. His worship matched his **service** (v. 19)

## TABLE TALK QUESTIONS

1. Read 2 Samuel 6:1-3. What are the missteps David committed which led to failing the return of the Ark of the Covenant to Jerusalem?
2. 2 Samuel 6:3 illustrates the failure of using a "new cart" and employing people with "personality" to bring the presence of God. In what way does the current worship culture fall into the same mold? How can we maintain the proper way of worshipping God?
3. Read 2 Samuel 6:13. What is the significance of walking six steps and the meaning of the sacrifices offered? How are these steps contrasted with what David did earlier? How can we apply this in our lifestyle of worship today?
4. Read 2 Samuel 6:14. We will find that David wore a linen ephod as he danced before the Lord. What is the significance of this act and its role in returning the Ark of the Covenant to Jerusalem?
5. Read 2 Samuel 6:19. How did David match worship with service?
6. Last week, we talked about the different postures for worship. But worship also is about walking in faith and obedience. If there is one person who understands both sides of the spectrum, it is King David. He was an accomplished musician but also a man who knew after the heart of God. What are some godly attributes we can draw from David's example as a worshipper?
