1.	In the last three weeks of our series on the life of Jacob, what were some sections of his journey that mirror your own life?
2.	Jacob spent 20 years in Haran after leaving Beersheba. This "in-between" period transformed Jacob in many facets of his life. Read the passages below and reflect on applying these principles during your "in-between."

3.	Read Genesis 32:22-32. Discuss the significance of several details in this account: Jacob being alone, at a river, at the end of exile, wrestling, the name change from Jacob to Israel, the time of day, etc.
4.	Read Genesis 28:10-20. How are Jacob's two encounters with God in Bethel and Peniel similar? How are they different? What can we learn about how God deals with us through the uncertainties and unknowns?
5.	Read Genesis 32:31-32. What comes to mind when you think about your scars and limps? Share your thoughts about how being a true Christ-follower is not about getting stronger; it's about growing increasingly aware of our weakness and the Lord's strength.
6.	Close the Life Group meeting by praying for each other's 'limp' and the strength and

resolve to live the purpose of God in our lives.
