- A. David's heart as a worshipper was expressed in...
  - 1. His **PASSION** for God's presence = Outward **Demonstration** 
    - a. The way he gave **reverence** (v.13)
    - b. The way he rejoiced (vv.12, 14)
    - c. The way he **responded** by blessing God's people (vv. 18, 19)
  - 2. His **PERSPECTIVE** of worship = Inner **Motivation** 
    - a. Reverence before God and not for show (v. 21)
    - b. **Response** to what God has done in his life (v. 21)
  - 3. The **POSTURE** of his heart = Humble **Disposition** 
    - a. The way he **stripped** himself of his kingly garments (v. 14)
    - b. The way he **viewed** of himself before God (v. 22)
    - c. The way he **responded** to Michal's criticism (v.22)

  - 1. Love Him above all
  - 2. Live for Him
  - 3. Look to Him

- 2. What mistake did David and his men make in transporting the Ark, and what were the consequences? (2 Samuel 6:3-7)
- 3. What was David's initial reaction to Uzzah's death, and how did his attitude change? (2 Samuel 6:8-12)
- 4. Describe the second attempt to bring the Ark to Jerusalem. How was it different from the first? (2 Samuel 6:13-15)
- 5. What was Michal's reaction to David's worship, and how did David respond? (2 Samuel 6:16-23)
- 6. How do you ensure that your worship to God is both reverent and joyful?
- 7. In what ways might we, like Uzzah or Michal, sometimes take God's presence lightly or focus more on appearances rather than the heart of worship?
- 8. How can we apply the lessons from David's experience in our own lives, particularly in how we lead or participate in worship?
