Introduction:

A. Paul's legacy is defined.

- 1. He viewed his life as an offering (v.6)
- 2. His legacy has an **enormous** and **lasting impact**.
- B. Paul's legacy is refined.
 - 1. It was refined through seasons of waiting (Gal. 1:15-18, NLT)
 - 2. It was refined through <u>life's struggles</u> (v. 7)
- C. Paul's legacy has perspective.
 - 1. He has a **sense of urgency** (vs. 6-7)
 - 2. He built a balanced legacy between the **temporal** (Acts 18:3; Rom. 13:6; Acts 23:16-17) and the **eternal** (v. 8)
 - 3. He kept his eternal focus.
 - On the reward (v. 8)
 - On Jesus and His return (v. 8; Heb. 12:2)
 - On his new home (Col. 3:1-3 NLT)
